

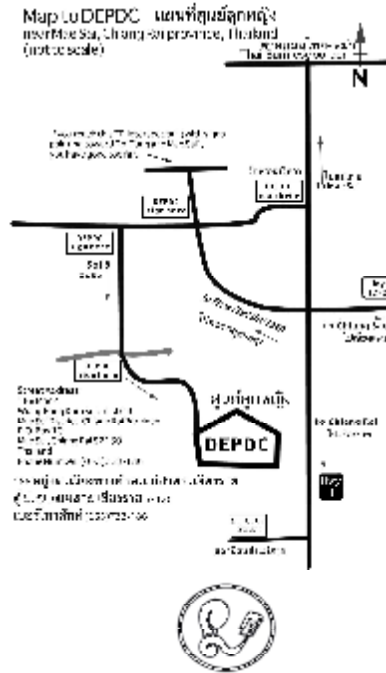
Aims

Development Education Program for Daughters & Communities Centre (DEPDC) is a non-profit, community based, prevention-orientated NGO offering free education, a safe-shelter and full-time accommodation to at-risk women and children to try and prevent them from being trafficked into the sex industry or any other exploitative forced-labour situation. It also reaches out at a community level to raise awareness of human trafficking. DEPDC is situated in Mae Sai, the northern-most town in Thailand, right on the Burmese border.

Child Voice Radio

Child trafficking, prostitution and forced labour affect the whole community. By reaching out, bringing people together and informing them of these and other local issues, we can take one step further in the struggle for better child rights and protection.

Child Voice Radio (CVR) broadcasts to Mae Sai and the surrounding area hoping to achieve that aim. On air from 05.30 – 22.00, seven days a week, DJs present shows in Thai, Burmese, English, Lao and Chinese, as well as hill tribe languages. Alongside the issues of trafficking and human rights, the shows cover everything from AIDS awareness to cooking and cater for a wide range in musical tastes, playing a mix of local traditional music and artists from both Thai and Western popular culture.

English shows

The Morning Show aims to reach the local tourists and ex-pats as well as the wider community. The show broadcasts from 08.00 to 09.00 Monday to Saturday and is presented by a range of foreign volunteers.

Easy English is a half-hour English lesson aimed at the local community and broadcast from 19.30 to 20.00 Monday to Friday.

CVR is now going out live over the internet, streaming to countries across the world and bringing the issues of child trafficking and the work of the DEPDC to an truly international audience. Tune in at <http://depdc.no-ip.info:9000/>.
